Post-it Challenge:

The Ascension of the Lord, Year A

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him,

though some hesitated.

Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you.

Reflection:



In this Gospel, forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus ascended into Heaven. The disciples were with Him on the mountain as He prepared to leave them. They were devastated that He was going, but took comfort from His reassurance that he would be with them always through His Spirit.

Jesus gave instructions to His friends – to make disciples of all the nations, to baptise them in God's name and to keep His commandments. This was a huge job...to make disciples, to teach and to baptize! However, it was these very acts which made people follow them and want to become Christians. It was by their teaching, the witness of their lives and the power of their actions which made others become followers of Jesus.

From his place with God in heaven, Jesus promised to help his disciples. To this day, He continues to help us as we try to live as his followers. If we ask Him, Jesus will help us to keep His commands and follow his example.
