

Reflection:

On this feast day, we celebrate the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, Trinity meaning three. This is the central mystery of the Christian faith. God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world as a man, in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, Jesus, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit.

This is a relationship of unity, of being together but each having different tasks to do - God the Father as our maker and creator of heaven and earth, Jesus, God becoming man and living among us and the Spirit, sent to guide us and give us strength to live the truth in everything we do – three persons, one God.

As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but wants to save it. At the heart of our understanding of the Holy Trinity is the knowledge that God loves us no matter what!
