Dear Parents,

This week started with heavy snow, which hopefully brought some excitement to your home. A much-needed distraction, I'm sure.

This week our Prime minister made the announcement that he hopes it will be safe to reopen schools in England from 8th March, if the Government's target to vaccinate everyone in the four most vulnerable groups by the 15th February is achieved. I am conscious of the impact this news will have on many of you, who are doing so tremendously with remote education, but finding things difficult nevertheless. Please rest assured that each family, in its own unique circumstances, will continue to have our ongoing support.

At this time, I am pleased with remote-learning engagement so far and we are continuing to review our remote learning offer, to ensure it is the best we can offer for our children and families. Therefore, with this letter I am also sending out information about TEAMS, a Microsoft Office APP which will enable us to enhance our provision further, through live sessions. We are currently in the process of circulating individual pupil emails and passwords. Please look out for these which you should receive by early next week. Once they have been circulated, your teacher will arrange a live "class check in" session. This will be an opportunity to come together virtually at the start of the day.

## **The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch**

Big Schools' Birdwatch is back bring nature to you. Join thousands of people taking part to see the drama unfold on your doorstep. Taking Part is easy. Spend an hour counting the birds you see in your garden or from your balcony, then tell us what you saw. It really is that simple!

### **Instructions**

- ✓ Pick a time -You can choose any hour between 29 and 31 January. So whether you're an early bird or a night owl, you can still take part.

- ✓ Tell us what you see - Count the birds you see in your garden or from your balcony\*. Ignore any birds that are still in flight. To avoid double-counting, just record the highest number of each bird species you see at any one time – not a running total.

*\*This year the advice is to take part in the safety of your own home. This could include a birdwatch from your window if you overlook a green space or courtyard.*
