

#### Sssssshhh...said Miss Forrestall and Mrs Iqbal!

In St Claudine and St Faustina classes this week, we planned and conducted an experiment to test which materials are most effective at soundproofing noise.

We worked in groups with a pot of plastic counters and a range of different materials including tin foil, newspaper, cling film and bubble wrap. We wrapped the pot in layers of these materials and recorded how loud the sound of the counters was when the pot was shaken after adding each layer. We shared our findings and concluded that the bubble wrap was the most effective material for soundproofing.
