Our plans for a full return September 2020

We are pleased to have received the Initial government guidance for a full return in September. It is very much in-line with what we expected and we have been busy preparing for this. The Covid arrangements in place currently, have worked exceptionally well in keeping everyone safe. As all children are expected to return in September we will be adding to the existing measures by:

Having new staggered arrival times and points of entry.

To ensure that teaching time is not affected we will be splitting the school into 2 distinct groups with *Group 1 arriving at 8.45am* and *Group 2 arriving at 8.55am*. Children will be admitted through the gate at their specific time. To minimise contact we will only allow Reception parents to enter the school site at the start of the day. Year 1 parents will be able to enter initially on the Thursday and Friday.

Start/Finish times for the day

Once children arrive they are to go straight to class. Only Nursery and Reception parents allowed on site at the start of the day / Year 1 - first day only.

Staff members will be available to meet and greet, directing children promptly and safely to the direction of classes.

In line with Government directives, face coverings will not be allowed in school. Any child wearing a face covering to travel to school will need to remove safely before entry.

Collection -

There will be a Controlled pick up time following a circular route thus creating a one way system to enter and exit the school site.

Parents enter via the adventure playground gate next to the hall. The one way route will go round to the main playground, then exiting via the Foundation class side of the school by the large carpark.

The reception children and Key Stage 1 will be picked up as normal from their classroom and will need to follow the one way route too. Please note-Parents must not gather and should exit the school site as quickly as possible to minimise contact.

In line with the new guidance we will build on our existing practise:

- Classes will keep to their rooms as much as possible.
- There will be no whole school assemblies or gatherings taking place until the Government directives permit.
- Most children will eat their lunches in their classes to reduce opportunities of mixing with other classes
- Lunchtimes will be staggered to reduce contact with other classes
- Allocated outdoor space will be given to each class
- Desks will face forward as per directive.

Our teachers have been working hard to plan the new curriculum for the next school year; we have re-written many of the topics, and we are excited to share them with the children. Teachers are also working together to plan how to ensure children are given the best chances to catch up the lost learning in many subjects including Reading, Writing, Maths and Science. We also hope to have a meet the teacher session, for parents in September. (If rules allow)

It is likely that there will be more guidelines and advice from the government over the summer and we will be ready to react to any changes in circumstances or events and will work hard to keep you informed. Please do look at the websites for updates and messages through parentmail. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
