The Early Years Foundation Stage: Reception

There are seven areas of learning and development that shape our curriculum. All areas of learning and development are important and inter-connected.

Three areas are particularly important for building a foundation for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, forming relationships and thriving.

These are the prime areas:

- communication and language
- physical development
- personal, social and emotional development

There are four specific areas, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied. The specific areas are:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

This carriers on from your child's nursery/pre-school learning journey towards the Early Learning Goals.

We plan activities and experiences for all these areas using the children's individual interests and experiences. There are opportunities for learning in both indoor and outdoor settings.




A day in the life of a Reception child at St Gregory's Catholic Primary School...








At St Gregory's Catholic Primary School, our curriculum is underpinned by a Catholic education based on the life and teaching of Jesus Christ, in which the values of the Gospel underpin all aspects of school life. We insist on the highest standards of academic achievement so that our young people leave us as 'agents of change' – educated and caring people who have the knowledge and skills they need to flourish as human beings and make the world a better place. We have weekly RE lessons where we learn about the Catholic Faith, as well as learning about different Faiths and cultures.




We have daily Maths lessons which involve learning about the value of numbers, 2d and 3d shapes, doubling, halving and becoming problem solvers. We have Phonics and English lessons every day. We follow a Phonics programme called Read Write Inc. This helps us to read and write by the end of Reception.













We have PE lessons once a week, which are led by PE Specialists. All children will need a PE kit which consists of:

Plain, white short sleeved t-shirt (no logo)

Plain, black bottoms: leggings, joggers or shorts (no logo)

Trainers or black plimsolls

Optional: plain, black zip up hoody or sweatshirt (no logo)

Free School Meals

All Reception and KS1 children are entitled to a free school meal. Parents can still opt to provide their child with a packed lunch if they wish to do so.

Our school lunches are provided by the external catering company Coombs.



The School Gateway is now live You can now credit your child's account and start ordering school meals

What you need to do now:

Download the app: If you have a smartphone, please download School Gateway from your app store (Android and iPhone). The app shows the same information as the website

OR

Visit the website: www.schoolgateway.com and click on new user. You'll receive a text message with a PIN number. Use this PIN to login to School Gateway.

Meals have to be ordered before 12 midnight, 2 days before the meal is taken

For example: Order Saturday before 12 midnight for the meal on Monday, Sunday before 12 midnight for Tuesday & Monday before 12 midnight for Wednesday etc.

Advice for starting school

- Help your child to develop the skills they need to be independent, such as going to the toilet, dressing themselves and looking after their possessions.
- Get storybooks from the library about starting school and read them to your child.
- Encourage your child to label their pictures with letters from their names.
- Play with lots of play dough to develop fine motor skills!
- Play outdoors lots this develops gross motor skills and children's confidence in trying new things (such as climbing a climbing frame.)
