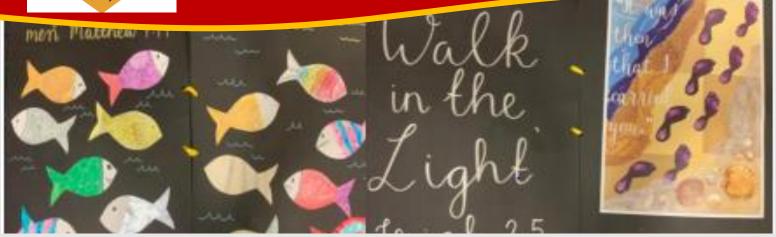

Mrs Yuen's Coronation Competition

Mrs Yuen has set the children a challenge to enter her Coronation Story Competition.

'The year 2023 is the year of a royal coronation. Your can set your story in any time period or place across the world in the past, as long as it links to the theme of Coronation Your story can be about a real or fictional coronation, but in a context that hooks into some of the symbolism and themes around coronation.'

All pupils, in any year group are encouraged to enter and the closing date is **Monday 15th May**.

Celebrating the Coronation

On Saturday 6th May, we will see something that most of us have never experienced in our lifetime: a coronation. In school, we will be marking this historic moment in a variety of ways.

On Thursday 4th May, each class will participate in a 'Happy and Glorious' workshop each focusing on a notable member of the monarchy over time. Year 4 pupils, under the expert guidance of Mrs Brown, have decorated a crown to add to the display in Weston Favell Shopping Centre. We also have our Coronation Coin Challenge, where we are asking pupils to bring in any space change to add to the pot in the classroom. On Friday, we will create a large coin crown and the proceeds of this will go towards the planting of a commemorative tree in the school grounds.
