

Learning about Judaism

This week, Year 4 have been exploring Judaism as part of our focus on Other Faiths. The children learned about the importance of

the Torah, how it is kept in the synagogue and how beautifully it can be decorated. We made our own mini Torah scrolls and made sure they were decorated to show how sacred the Torah is to Jewish people.



Dinosaur Investigation

The children in Reception are studying dinosaurs just like paleontologists who are scientists that study fossils of living things from the past. We have

been looking closely at our word of the week: 'extinct', thinking about how dinosaurs no longer exist. The children have learned the vocabulary 'herbivore' and 'carnivore' and their definitions.



We remember...

Last week, pupils in St Catherine of Siena class remembered the soldiers who have given their lives in service. The children learned about blackout poetry and read the poem, 'In Flanders Fields', selecting the phrases that stood out to them and added a wartime image over the rest of the poem to create some striking art work.

'In honour of remembering all the soldiers who died in all the wars, we commemorated Remembrance Day by creating blackout artwork and also drawing poppies over a copy of the poem in our class Reflection Book. We paid our respects and we will always remember them.' - Nona
